




DAYTRIPPER by GABRIEL BA & FABIO MOON


EUREKA SEVEN: PSALMS OF PLANETS by JINSEL KATAOKA


IN REAL LIFE by CORY DOCTOROW


MARVELS by KURT BUSIESK & ALEX ROSS (illustrator)

A new take on classic heroes




MS. MARVEL: NO NORMAL by G. WILLOW WILSON (2)


MONSTER by WALTER DEAN MYERS AFRICAN AMERICAN


THE SHADOW HERO by GENE LUEN YANG


THIS ONE SUMMER by MARIKO TAMAKI, illustrated by JILLIAN TAMAKI REALISTIC FICTION
